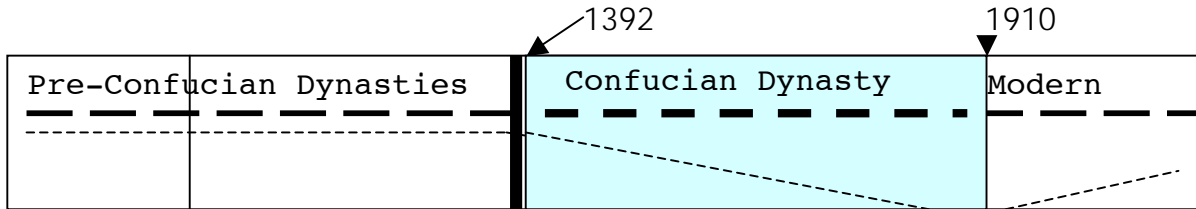


WALL CHART (approx. 2' x 12')

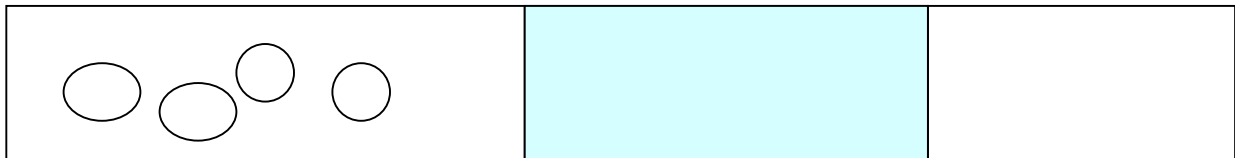
THE SETTING:



— — — Solid line is male, showing them as always in power.

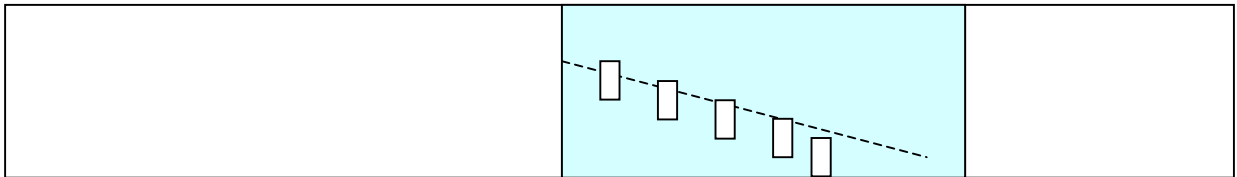
..... Dashed line is female, showing that in pre-Confucian times there were many areas of equality, followed by the introduction of Confucian government and the erosion of women's rights .

○ Circles - add to the left hand side of the chart during the brief discussion of important aspects of Korean history. Each circle has one major point of Korean life, so that learning can take place with very little teacher-talk, and the main points can remain in view during the lesson.



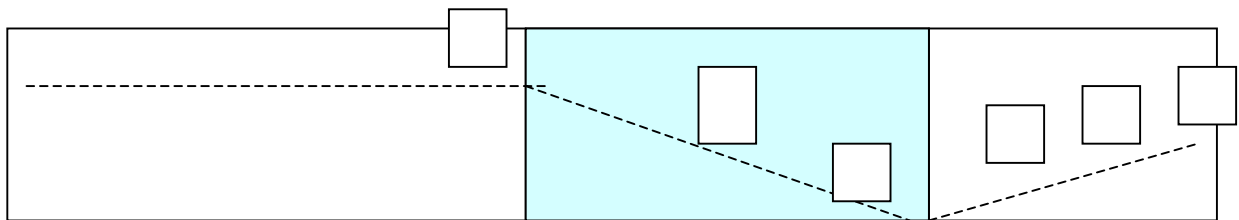
1. Civilized – literate 50 BC ->
