## Friday, 2/22/13 Asian Art Museum in San Francisco

In the morning (8-9 a.m.), we will take the BART from Downtown Berkeley to visit the Asian Art Museum at the heart of Civic Center, San Francisco. February 22nd is the opening day of the museum's Terracotta Warriors, a special exhibit of the artifacts unearthed from the tomb of China's first emperor, Qin Shihuang (259-210 BCE). The museum's main collection contains 18,000 objects (ranging from tiny, handcrafts to monumental sculptures), artworks offering a comprehensive introduction to all major cultures of Asia, and the entire collection spans 6,000 years. We will take lunch nearby, north of Market Street and spend some time visiting the picturesque buildings that make up the Civic Center.



Scholars are expected to purchase their own admissions and meals. There will be additional fees to enter the Terracotta Warriors exhibit. Please feel free to visit the museum website -->
